## Who is dtp

Downtown Tucson Partnership (DTP) is a 501(c)6 organization working to promote the continued vitality of Downtown Tucson. We care about everyone in our urban center including those experiencing homelessness, which is why we want to help connect those in-need with available services.

## What we do

Through a partnership with Old Pueblo Community Services (OPCS), homeless individuals are receiving services and being placed in homes and shelters utilizing the Housing First model. Onsite interviews and assessments were provided by a dedicated community engagement specialist at homeless encampments and on the street via a DTP Connects mobile unit. The mobile unit continues to make contact with individuals every Tuesday and Thursday.

By collaborating with various organizations in the Tucson area, we are reducing homelessness in our city.

## dtp connects facts

Approx. 80 homeless individuals were placed in housing between 12/1/17-3/1/18\*\*

Chronic street homelessness Downtown has decreased by 96%\*

Illegal camping in Jacome Plaza has decreased by 100%\*

Average park users per day range from 175 - 250.\*

75% of park users are women.\*

53% of park users are children.\*

Criminal activity in Jacome Plaza has decreased by 96%.
